



Tammy Villarreal

I am the current President of the WGV Athletics Booster Club (WGVABC) running for reelection. I have been involved with gymnastics for over 8 years and as a parent-volunteer with WGV Gymnastics (WGV) since it was founded. I hold a current AAU and USAG coaching certificate, Safety and Risk Management certificate, and have a current background check. I have vast knowledge of compulsory, optional, and excel gymnastics rules and routines.

I am an accomplished professional with an extensive legal background. I have supported CEO's and general counsel, both domestic and international, in corporate law, personal injury and intellectual property. I currently work as the Legal Assistant to Wayne Hogan, the President of the law firm Terrell Hogan, I am highly organized, efficient, and computer savvy.

In 2012 WGVABC was formed and I was voted in by club members to serve on the Board as Vice President. In 2014 I was elected to serve as President and continue to serve to date. I played a key role in helping establish the 501(c)(3) (non-profit) status of the Booster Club.

As President I dedicate and volunteer a significant amount of hours every week. I oversee all board positions; attend board meetings; organize, participate, and volunteer at fundraisers; assist in designing leotards, t-shirts, and warm-ups; order all uniforms; travel to pick up leotards, bags, trophies, and other items for the team; work with the Treasurer to ensure that annual reports, taxes and, other documents pertaining to the 501(c)(3) status are current and filed in a timely manner; determine what purchases would be beneficial to the team; work with the Sponsorship Coordinator and help prepare brochures and any other marketing materials needed to obtain sponsors; and work with board members and parent volunteers on fundraisers.

Together with the board and parent volunteers, during my presidency we have been successful in raising money for team lockers, supplying each gymnast with a WGV bag, purchasing two vending machines; paying a portion of each competition attended for the last two years, paying for each gymnast to attend the State meet for the past two years, paying for the AAU credentials and partial payment for USAG credentials for each gymnast; paid for the AAU and USAG credentials for coaches, and providing sponsorship t-shirts to each gymnast.

Another volunteer position I have served WGV in is as Team Coordinator. I meet with the Owner, Program Director, and Coaches on a regular basis to discuss the competitive team. I have developed a great relationship with Florida meet directors and the AAU and USAG Board of Directors, which resulted in WGV working the USAG Level 2 state meet and, most recently, having been asked to work a meet in January. As Team Coordinator, I complete all necessary paperwork to obtain the appropriate credentials for both coaches and gymnasts and register coaches and gymnasts for all meets. In January 2015, I completed and submitted all necessary paperwork for WGV to host its first sanctioned meet and annually thereafter.

I was instrumental in getting the Excel program started at WGV. I contacted other gyms that had the program and obtained their input on how to start the program at WGV. I presented the information to the Program Director who implemented it. We started the Excel program with one gymnast and now we have seven.

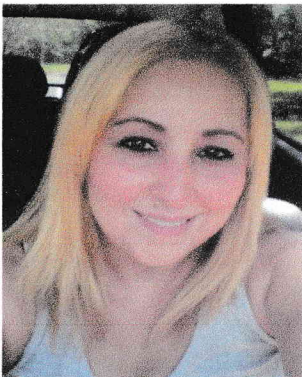

I have served as the WGVABC treasurer for the past two years. As treasurer, I collect fees, invoice, audit, submit tax information for nonprofit status, process payments, bookkeep 68+ accounts (and growing), purchase items, keep up with all non-profit 501c3 rules and regulations, attend all board meetings, ensure bills are paid in a timely fashion, and oversee all fundraisers. I also oversee and account for all physical inventory and ensure that all of the girls have correct uniform sizes recorded. In addition to my work as treasurer, I often help answer phones, take payments, and greet new gymnasts at the front desk.
